


## SKILL LEVEL

## easy

SIZES
Small (Medium, Large)

MATERIALS

- Katia Bamboo (60\% bamboo, 40\% cotton/ $50 \mathrm{~g}(1.75 \mathrm{oz}) / 109 \mathrm{yd})$ or [Tahki Cotton Classic ( $100 \%$ cotton $/ 50 \mathrm{~g} / 108 \mathrm{yd}$ )]:
MC: \#4 [\#3488] red - $2(3,3)$ balls
MCO: \#17 [\#3402] dark orange - 1 ball
- small amount of sport-weight baby yarn in orange (CO), leaf green (CG), hot pink (CP) and red (CR)
- $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ ( 15 MM ) plastic ring - 1
- 12 MM wood beads with 4MM hole - 2
- appliqué flowers - 10 (optional)


## CROCHET HOOK

C-2/2.75MM; D-3/3.25MM or size to obtain gauge

NOTIONS

- stitch markers
- yarn needle
- tape measure


## GAUGE

20 sc x 25 rows $=4^{\prime \prime}$

## TENSION

Be sure to check your tension before starting to crochet - if tension is too tight, change to larger hook; if it is too loose, change to smaller hook.

## BASE

Rnd 1: With MC and smaller crochet hook ch 2, 6 sc in $2^{\text {nd }}$ ch from hook, do not join, $p m$, work in continuous rounds, moving marker at the end of each round $=6 \mathrm{sc}$.

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc around $=12 \mathrm{sc}$.
Rnd 3: sc in $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc, [sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] around $=18 \mathrm{sc}$.
Rnd 4: [sc in next $2 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc] around $=24 \mathrm{sc}$.
Rnd 5: [sc in next $3 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc ] around $=30 \mathrm{sc}$.
Rnd 6: [sc in next $4 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc ] around $=36 \mathrm{sc}$.
Rnd 7: [sc in next $5 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc] around $=42 \mathrm{sc}$.
Rnd 8: [sc in next $6 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc ] around $=48 \mathrm{sc}$.
Rnd 9: [sc in next $7 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc ] around $=54 \mathrm{sc}$.
Rnd 10: [sc in next $8 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc ] around $=60 \mathrm{sc}$.
Rnd 11: [sc in next $9 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc] around $=66 \mathrm{sc}$.
Rnd 12: [sc in next $10 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc ] around $=72$ sc.

Rnd 13: [sc in next $11 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc ] around $=78$ SC.
Rnd 14: [sc in next $12 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc ] around $=84$ sc.

Rnd 15: [sc in next $13 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc] around $=90$ SC.

## Medium and Large sizes ONLY

Rnd 16: [sc in next $14 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc] around $=96$ sc.
Rnd 17: [sc in next 15 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around = 102 sc.

Rnd 18: [sc in next 16 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around $=108$ sc.

## Large ONLY

Rnd 19: [sc in next 17 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around $=114$ sc.

Rnd 20: [sc in next 18 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around = 120 SC.
Rnd 21: [sc in next 19 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around $=126$ sc.

## All sizes

Rnd 16 (19, 22): sc in each sc around. DO NOT fasten off.

## BODY

NOTE: See diagram 2 on p. 4.
Rnd 1: ch 1, working in back loop only, sc in each sc around, join with sl st in beg ch-1.
Rnd 2: ch 1, sc in next sc, [sk 2 sc, 5 dc in next sc, sk 2 $\mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc] around, join with sl st in beg ch-1.
Rnd 3: ch 3,2 dc in $1^{\text {st }}$ sc, sk next 2 dc , sc in next dc, [5 dc in next sc, sk next 2 dc, sc in next dc] around, 2 dc in $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{sc}$, join with sl st in top of beg ch-3.
Rnd 4: ch 1, 5 dc in next sc, [sk 2 dc, sc in next dc, 5 dc in next sc] around, join with sl st to beg ch-1.

Rnds 5-16 (18, 22): Rep Rnds 3-4. At end of last row with MCO, join with sl st to beg ch-1. Fasten off MC.

## Ruffle ending

NOTE: See Ruffle diagram on p. 4.
Rnd 1: ch 6, sk 2 dc, sc in next dc, [ch 5, sc in next sc, ch 5 , sk 2 dc, sc in next dc], ch 5 , join with sl st to $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{ch}$ of beg ch-6.

Rnd 2: sl st in $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{ch}-5 \mathrm{sp}$, ch $3,8 \mathrm{dc}$ in same sp , [sc in next ch-sp, 9 dc in next ch-sp (shell made), sc in next ch-sp] around, join with sl st to beg st.

Rnd 3: ch 3, sk next dc, * dc in next dc, [ch 1, dc in next dc] 6 times, sk last dc of group ${ }^{* *}$ and $1^{\text {st }}$ dc of next group, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join with sl st to beg st.

Rnd 4: ch $1, *$ sc in next ch- sp, [ch 3, sc in next ch-1 sp] 5 times, sk next 2 dc, rep from * around, join with sl st to beg ch-1.

## Strap

- With 2 strands of MC held together and larger crochet hook ch approx 2-2.2 yards (75-83") strap.
- Weave strap in and out next ch-5 sp around. Slide wood bead onto each end. Tie knot; push bead to knotted end. Tie two ends of strap tog in front. Adjust tension so that ends of strap are equal.


## Strap holder

- With MC and smaller crochet hook work 14 sc around plastic ring, join with sl st in beg sc. Fasten off, leaving 8-10 yarn tail. Using yarn needle and yarn tail sew ring to center of base.


## FLOWER (make 8)

NOTE: Make 2 flowers in each CO, CG, CP, CR. See Flower diagram on p. 4.

- With MC ch 6 . Join with sl st in $1^{\text {st }}$ ch to form a ring.


Rnd 1(RS): ch 2, 11 sc in ring, join with sl st in $2^{\text {nd }} \mathrm{ch}$ of beg ch 2.

Rnd 2: ch 6, sk next sc, [sc in next sc, ch 5, sk next sc] 5 times, join with sl st in $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{ch}$ of beg ch $6=6 \mathrm{ch}-5 \mathrm{sps}$.

Rnd 3: ch 1, [sc, hdc, 4 dc, hdc, sc] in each ch-5 sp around (petal made), join with sl st in $1^{\text {st }} s c$. Fasten off.
Rnd 4: Working in back of petals, ch $2, \mathrm{sc}$ in $2^{\text {nd }} \mathrm{sc}$ of Rnd 1 , [ch 6, sk next sc, sc in next sc] 5 times, ch 6 , sl st in $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{sc}$; cut MC. With CB, join with sl st in st just made.

Rnd 5: ch 1, [sc, hdc, dc, 4 tr, dc, hdc, sc] in each ch-5 sp around (petal made), join with sl st in $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{sc}$. Fasten off, leaving 10-12 yarn tail.

## FINISHING

- Referring to detail pictures and schematic (see pp. 5-6), using yarn needle and yarn tails, sew flowers to the bag. Sew flower appliques (optional). To transform bag to backpack foll tutorial on p. 6.
Weave in ends.

1. Using yarn needle and yarn tail sew ring to center of base.

2. Slide strap onto the ring.

3. Tie knot.
