


CROCHETED PIN eBook





This miniature butterfly not only announce the sunny days ahead, but such wonderful accent for a hat, sweater, halter, bag, scarf, gloves - you name it! For fun fashion hair accents, attach clips or barrettes to the back instead of brooch back. This beautiful crocheted Butterfly pin work up quickly and make great gifts too. Can be made in any colors combination with any yarn you would decide. Get a fun to create your own!

SKILL LEVEL

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beginner

SIZE

one size. Size can be adjusted by using a larger/smaller hook or thicker/thinner yarn.

MATERIALS

- MC: Ornaghi Filati Alicante (100% Egyptian Cotton 50 g (1.75 oz)/ 138 yd): #67 yellows - 1 ball
 - **NOTE**: Several butterflies can be made from single ball of yarn.
- small amount of baby sport yarn in yellow gold (CA)
- white butterfly antennae 1
- 27MM safety catch brooch back 1

CROCHET HOOK

C-2/2.75MM

NOTIONS

• yarn needle

GAUGE

 $3^{1/2} \times 2^{1/4''}$ across widest points. Gauge is not critical for this design



BUTTERFLY

NOTE: See Diagram 1 on p. 4.

• With **MC**, ch 10. Join with sl st in the 1st ch to form a ring.

NOTE: Always start with ch 3 instead of 1^{st} dc of rnd. At the end of rnd, join with sl st in 1^{st} sc or 3^{rd} (dc) ch at beg of rnd.

Rnd 1(RS): 32 dc in ring = 32 dc.

Rnd 2: shell in 1st dc, sk next 3 dc, [shell in next dc, sk next 3 dc] around = 8 shells.

Rnd 3: sl st in first 3 sts (to ch-3 sp of 1st shell), * (7 dc, ch 3, 7 dc) in 1st ch-3 sp (large wing made), sc bet next 2 shells, (7 dc, ch 3, 7 dc) in next ch-3 sp (another large wing made), sc bet next 2 shells, 12 dc in next ch-3 sp (small wind made), sc bet next 2 shells, 12 dc in next ch-3 sp (another small wing made), sc bet next 2 shells; rep from * once more. With **CA**, join with sl st to top of beg ch-3 (dc). Fasten off **MC**.

Rnd 4: Working in back loops only, ch 1, sc in each dc around and 6 sc in each ch-3 sp.

Rnd 4: working from left to right, reverse (crab) sc in each st around. Fasten off.

ASSEMBLY

- Fold Butterfly in half matching wrong side of large wings to wrong side of large wings and wrong side of small wings to wrong side of small wings.
- Butterfly Body Center: With **RS** facing and working trough both thickness of Butterfly, holding working yarn on **WS** of piece, join 2 strands of **CA** with sl st at bottom of center line (bet 2 sets of small wings), sl st evenly along center line to top of body center. Holding antennae at center of Butterfly body (bet 2 sets of large wings), attach antennae with sl st to hold in place. Fasten off.
- Weave in ends. Sew or glue brooch back to center back.

SPECIAL STITCHES USED

Shell: (3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in same st

ABBREVIATIONS

beg - beginning bet - between ch - chain dc - double crochet rep - repeat rnd - round RS - right side sc - single crochet sk - skip sl st - slip stitch WS - wrong side





SKILL LEVELS Perfect for new knitters and crocheters using basic stitches. beginner Minimal shaping. Projects using yarn with basic stitches, repetitive stitch patterns, easy simple color changes, and simple sharping and finishing. Projects using a variety of techniques, such as basic lace patterns intermediate or color patterns, mid-level shaping and finishing. Projects with intricate stitch patterns, more advanced techniques, experienced or detailed shaping.
