





Wonderful accent for a hat, sweater, bag, scarf, gloves or whatever you can think of! This beautiful Rose brooch work up quickly and make great gifts too. Can be made in any colors combination, this one is also a great project for trying your hand at thread crochet. Get a fun to create your own!

SKILL LEVEL



SIZE

one size

MATERIALS

 DMC Traditions Crochet Thread, Size 10 (100 % Mercerized Cotton/50 gr /175 yd) #04 pink - 1 ball #18 baby pink - 1 ball #42 turquoise - 1 ball #10 green - 1 ball

NOTE: Many roses and leaves can be made from a single ball of thread.

• 27MM safety catch brooch back - 1

CROCHET HOOK

Size 7 (1.65MM) steel crochet hook

NOTIONS

• yarn needle

GAUGE

gauge is not critical for this design



ROSE BODY (make 3)

NOTE: See Diagram 1 on p. 4.

• Ch 76.

Row 1(RS): dc in 5th ch from hook, dc in each ch across, turn = 73 dc.

Row 2: ch 1, sc in 1st dc, [sk 2 dc, 8 dc in next dc, sk 2 dc, sc in next dc] 3 times, [sk 3 dc, 12 dc in next dc, sk 3 dc, sc in next dc] 3 times, [sk 4 dc, 15 dc in next dc, sk 4 dc, sc in next dc] 3 times. Fasten off, leaving 8-10" yarn tail.

• Make one with pink, one with baby pink and one with turquoise.

LEAF (make 3)

NOTE: See Diagram 2 on the right.

• With green ch 16.

Row 1(RS): sc in 2nd ch from hook, * hdc in next 2 chs, dc in next 3 chs, tr in next 3 chs, dc in next 3 chs, hdc in next 2 chs, * 3 sc in last ch; working in free loops of beg ch, rep from * to *, sc in next ch, do not turn.

Row 2: ch 1, sc in beg ch, sl st in next 15 sts, (sl st, ch 3, sl st) in next sc, sl st in each st across to beg ch. Fasten off, leaving 8-10" yarn tail.

BROOCH BASE

NOTE: See Diagram 3 on p. 4.

• With green ch 4, join with sl st in the 1st ch to form a ring.

Rnd 1(RS): ch 1, 7 sc in ring, join with sl st in beg ch = 7 sc.

Rnd 2: ch 1, 2 sc in each sc around = 14 sc.

Rnd 3: ch 1, [2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc] around = 21 sc.

Rnd 4: ch 1, [2 sc in next sc, sc in next 2 sc] around = 28 sc.

Rnd 5: ch 1, [2 sc in next sc, sc in next 3 sc] around = 35 sc.

Rnd 6: ch 1, [2 sc in next sc, sc in next 4 sc] around = 42 sc.

Rnd 7: ch 1, [2 sc in next sc, sc in next 5 sc] around = 49 sc. Fasten off.

FINISHING

• Foll tutorial (see p. 4) form a Roses bouquet. Sew safety Catch Brooch back to center of Pin Base.

TIP: Brooch Back also can be glued (hot glue is recommended).

Weave in ends.

ABBREVIATIONS

beg - beginning ch - chain hdc - half double crochet dc - double crochet rep - repeat rnd - round RS - right side sc - single crochet sk - skip sl st - slip stitch tr- treble crochet WS - wrong side




SKILL LEVELS	
• OOO beginner	Perfect for new knitters and crocheters using basic stitches. Minimal shaping.
easy	Projects using yarn with basic stitches, repetitive stitch patterns, simple color changes, and simple sharping and finishing.
intermediate	Projects using a variety of tech- niques, such as basic lace patterns or color patterns, mid-level shap- ing and finishing.
experienced	Projects with intricate stitch pat- terns, more advanced techniques, or detailed shaping.

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How to form a Roses bouquet



1. With WS of Brooch Base, thread yarn needle with yarn tail and sew the Leaves as shown above.



2. With WS of Rose body and starting from the smalest scallop edge, roll rose into spiral, thread yarn needle with yarn tail and sew at back to hold spiral in place.




3. Sew Roses at back to hold them in place.



4. Sew Roses bouquet to center of Base circle.
